The World of Robert Burns

Head into **Robbie Burns country**, traveling south along the coast, overlooking the Firth of Clyde and the Isles of Bute and Arran and passing through many seaside towns as you drive deep into the heart of Ayrshire. The famous bard, who wrote the world-famous song *Auld Lang Syne*, was born and raised in this area of southwest Scotland—the countryside that inspired him to write m...
