Today's adventure begins with a high-speed **catamaran** ride from Haines to**Skagway**, featuring magnificent views of mountains and waterfalls as you cruise through the deepest fjord in North America. Once in Skagway, relax and enjoy a 20-minute narrated **coach tour of historic downtown Skagway** before heading north on the Klondike Highway. Next, a short **walk** on a rain forest trail brings you to a spectacular adventure park, where expert guides will outfit you with safety equipment. Listen to some instructions; then, you're off to enjoy the thrill of the ropes course and zip line experience. The **ropes course** includes Burma loops, a suspended bridge and raised balance beam. Next up is a fantastic series of six **zip lines** through the lush Alaska forest canopy. As you zip from platform to platform, fellow participants cheer you on. The adrenalin will be pumping as you prepare for the final segment, soaring high above the ground through the treetops. You'll have approximately 2 1/2 hours to enjoy this adventure location; then, enjoy a **snack** of hot cocoa, coffee and trail mix before heading back to the pier in Skagway for your transportation back to Haines. Take in the spectacular scenery en route. Notes:

Participants must be able to hike uphill over uneven natural terrain in order to access the course. Wear sturdy, closed-toe shoes; dress in warm, layered clothing that allows for freedom of movement. Hop aboard a bus for a ride along the **Haines Scenic Byway**. This narrated drive, with plenty of stories about the history of the valley, brings you to a modern dock facility. Where the road ends, the real Alaska begins and so does your adventure.

Board a flat-bottomed **boat** to experience a guided ride along miles of scenic channels in the Chilkat River in the **Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve**. The vessel is specially designed for navigating this silt-laden river, which is the only access to this remote, roadless portion of the preserve. No other tour ventures into this same territory. The open-topped boat allows you to view and photograph the majestic scenery and wildlife in an unhindered fashion. Warm outerwear and lap blankets are provided.

Eagles, moose, and bears are often spotted along the riverbank, making for wonderful photo opportunities. The scenery alone is worth the trip with cascading, hanging glaciers and surrounding mountains that soar to 6,000-foot heights—this is the real, untouched beauty of Alaska.

After the boat ride, spend time with the captain, crew and staff around a **crackling campfire**. A **snack** and beverage are provided before you return to Haines. You'll be leaving the Bald Eagle Preserve with a myriad of amazing memories.



Explore the fascinating city of **Haines** with some intriguing visits to the area's best attractions. Your knowledgeable guide will meet you at the dock and escort you to the bus. Climb aboard and begin your exploration of Haines' Native culture, fascinating history and magnificent mountain and ocean views. First, you will be treated to a narrated **driving tour**through historic Fort Seward, the first US military base in Alaska. Then, you'll stop at the**American Bald Eagle Foundation's Raptor Center**—an interpretive wildlife education center—to watch a live feeding of this beautiful bird that is the symbol of America and learn more of the other native wildlife. You will also be treated to a live flight presentation of one of several birds of prey, enjoy an entertaining wildlife film, and savor a tasty smoked salmon snack. Next you will drive south of town along the **Chilkat Peninsula**, where glaciers, towering peaks, rivers and the sea all converge in amazing scenery. You'll visit the **oldest working cannery** in Alaska, owned and operated by the Haines Packing Company. The smokehouse was built in 1917 but it is now a state-of-the-art facility complete with pinbone extractors, blast freezers and vacuum packing machines. After the cannery you will be transported back to the cruise ship pier.

Notes:

The cannery may or may not be in operation at the time of your tour depending upon season and salmon catch. Minimum age is 8 years.

Eagle Preserve Float & Klukwan Native Culture Experience



Watch for eagles and other wildlife and experience the native culture of the Tlingit people on this spectacular combination of a river float trip and cultural experience.

Travel by bus to historic Fort Seward in the picturesque village of Haines.

Head up the highway and into the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve. There, you meet a naturalist guide and board a heavy-duty 18-foot raft to float quietly through the heart of the preserve. The preserve boasts the largest congregation of bald eagles in the world. Eagles, bears and wolves all frequent the region, coming here to feed on the plentiful salmon making their way upstream to their spawning beds.

Visit the native village of Klukwan--the mother village of the Tlingit nation, located at the confluence of three rivers. This historic village has seen a multitude of generations, making it an excellent place to experience the fascinating culture and history of the Tlingit people. Step into the Jilkaat Kwaan Heritage Center. This state-of-the-art, museum-quality center houses an array of cultural treasures of the Chilkat Tlingits. A guided tour through the facility highlights unique cultural art pieces and local Tlingit history.

Watch native artisans practicing their crafts in the art studio.

Walk through the exhibit hall to learn the stories behind some of the most famous pieces of Pacific Northwest Coast Native art in the world. The highly prized Whale House Collection collection, on loan from the Gaanaxteidi clan of Klukwan, was created more than 200 years ago

by Kaajísdu.axtch, a Tlingit master artist of genius level. This much-coveted collection has never been available for public viewing until its placement in this facility. Enjoy a picnic lunch with views of the Chilkat River.

You will also have some time to visit the gift shop, where local native arts and crafts can be purchased, or use the on-site spotting scopes to watch for eagles fishing for salmon in the Chilkat River.

The world-famous **Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve** boasts the largest gathering of bald eagles anywhere. It is also home to moose, bears, wolves, and a host of other animals. Your adventure begins with a spectacular drive up a National Scenic Byway, through the awe-inspiring Chilkat Valley to the heart of the preserve. After a riverside **picnic**, you will board an 18-foot inflatable raft and enjoy a peaceful float (no white water) down this ever-changing river. 7,000-foot peaks tower above you as you float past the ancient Native village of Klukwan. 



This outing provides a rare opportunity to focus on **photography** in the stunning 49th State specifically the scenery and wildlife of the Chilkat Valley. A limited number of participants will join a local, professional photographer on this four-hour journey. The emphasis is on taking time for excellent photography, rather than the photography being incidental. Even a simple "point and shoot" camera will work for this experience. Bring all your photography gadgets you are assured space for your equipment in the transportation. Your guide will suggest shots, and discuss issues such as exposure, use of flash and depth of field. (S)he is well versed in the wildlife and wildflowers at any given time of the season, and will ensure that you adhere to ethical wildlife viewing protocols. With a small group, the guide has the flexibility to pick and choose locations that fit the group and the seasonal conditions. Some locations lend themselves to longer or shorter stops, depending on the light, wildlife activity and weather. You may end up photographing bears along the Chilkoot River, an explosion of shooting star wildflowers at Chilkat State Park, or young bald eagles exercising their wings at the edge of their nests. The theme is flexibility, rather than a rigid schedule. A light **snack** is included with the tour.




Haines Off the Beaten Track

Their handcrafted timber-frame gallery is filled with unique creations by selected local artisans. Continue with a visit to the **Southeast Alaska State Fairgrounds** and **Dalton City**, created for the 1989 Walt Disney film White Fang. Stroll down Main Street and enjoy the attractions of this photogenic gold rush 'town' —the Haines Community Garden, the falsefronted buildings and a number of local artists and vendors. This scenic bus tour travels about 100 miles along the National Scenic Byway which passes through the world-famous Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, and travels into Canada. As we depart the dock in Haines on a tour bus, your expert cultural and naturalist guide will welcome you to the town of Haines and its fascinating geography, culture, and natural wonders. First, you will be treated to a short narrated driving tour through historic Fort Seward, one of the first US military bases in Alaska. Then, as we drive up the Haines Highway towards Canada, we enter the Bald Eagle Preserve. We drive along the National Scenic Byway through the awe-inspiring Chilkat Valley to the heart of the preserve and make a few stops to watch for wildlife and enjoy the incredible scenery. Your guide will tell stories about the fascinating local history and culture of the area. Passing through the Canadian border, we gain elevation and travel above tree-line. Towering peaks loom above the highway. There are fantastic views of glaciated peaks and wide expanses of alpine tundra. Along the way we'll stop for a delicious picnic-style lunch with a dramatic mountain backdrop. As we make our way back to Haines, we'll stop again along the Chilkat River to look for wildlife and take photos of the dramatic scenery.

Please be advised that this an easy panoramic tour, with stops for photos and lunch. The tour is not wheelchair accessible. The only walking involved is (dis)embarking the bus 2-3 times at scenic overlooks on the National Scenic Byway, which are either paved or well-maintained gravel turnouts. Participants can choose to stay seated in the bus throughout the tour. The picnic consists of coffee, tea, lemonade, water, chips and sandwiches. Haines Whales & Lighthouse Tales

Haines Alaska sits on the Chilkat Peninsula nestled between the Coast and Chilkat Mountain Ranges. Ice fields rim both shorelines and glacial nutrients kick start the food chain in these waters. This summer bloom provides for concentrating marine life in the waters of Lynn Canal. Keep a camera handy as we navigate the shorelines of these fertile waters. You'll see hanging glaciers, waterfalls, nesting bald eagles, harbor seals, and humpback or killer whales. Drifting and quietly observing humpback whale behavior is a highlight of the cruise. We'll also stop at a rookery where hundreds of Stellar sea lions gather in the summer to breed and pup. Our cruise destination stands stately on an island 18 miles south of Haines. The Eldred Rock Lighthouse, a picturesque and historic octagonal lighthouse, was first lit in 1906. It is the oldest remaining lighthouse in Alaska and one of the most remote in North America. The lighthouse was built after a series of disastrous shipwrecks that occurred there from steamships full of miners heading north to Skagway during the Klondike Gold Rush. The most famous shipwreck was the steamship Clara Nevada in February of 1898. As many as 75 lives and 850 pounds of gold were lost. The gold has never been discovered or the mystery of this disastrous shipwreck. As we hug the shoreline around the island of the lighthouse you will hear tales of the shipwrecks and get up close views of harbor seals basking on the rocks and nesting sea birds playing in the surf. Your cruise takes place aboard the Fjordland, a luxurious vessel specially designed for the waters of Lynn Canal and for viewing the scenery and wildlife up close. The 65 foot, state-ofthe-art, fast-hulled catamaran offers comfortable, indoor seating with 360-degree views and a large back deck for spending time outside where the sights, smells and sounds get closer yet. A tasty smoked salmon snack, fruit and beverages will be served underway







Take the wheel of a 4x4 Kawasaki Mule and join your friendly and knowledgeable guide for a journey through spectacular views of mountains and forests, including a panoramic view of the Lynn Canal and Chilkoot Lake from 1,500 feet elevation. A short bus transfer brings you to the Takshanuk Mountain trailhead, located in the heart of the Tongass National Forest. Your guide will demonstrate how to operate the Kawasaki Mule, an automatic transmission, 4x4 utility vehicle that is used to traverse the six-mile round-trip trail through some of the most pristine forest in Alaska. The mules are equipped with seat belts for up to five guests, are easily accessible and have storage for extra supplies and equipment. The excitement begins as you turn the key. Watch for bears at your first stop as you enjoy a **snack** of fresh-baked cookies and hot chocolate at the lodge. As you venture on, take advantage of the magnificent photo opportunities including crystal clear mountain streams, a cascading waterfall, a scenic alpine lake, and hopefully the occasional eagle or bear. At the sub-alpine meadow you will experience the panoramic view of the Lynn Canal, Chilkoot Lake and the many snow-capped mountains that make Alaska so famous. On the way down, you will stop once again at the exclusive mountaintop lodge to enjoy a warm fire, stunning views and a home-cooked halibut and chicken **lunch** made just for you. Naturalists take you to the sheltered valley of the **Chilkoot River**, for centuries a favorite fishing site for the **Tlingit** people and brown bears. As the sun slowly sets, bear families descend on the river, leaving the cover of the forest to forage along the grassy banks. From the protection of your bus, witness the food chain in action as thousands of salmon swim past the hungry bruins splashing and feeding in the water. Spotting scopes bring the action up close, as bald eagles, gulls, ravens, and ducks hover over the spawning fish. Discover the connection between the fish, bears, and the spruce trees lining the river. Following this foray into the wild Alaska night, guides share stories of life in a quaint **Alaska fishing village**while driving back through down

town Haines and historic Fort Seward. This unique bear viewing opportunity has limited capacity.

This tour is similar to the Nature & Wildlife Expedition excursion. Although wildlife sightings are not guaranteed, bears are seen frequently on these in-season departures. Current wildlife sighting updates are available through the Shore Excursions Office on board.






Wild at Heart: The Kroschel Center for Orphaned Animals
