Head out from Stornoway for the scenic drive to the island of **Great Bernera**, crossing the narrow bridge that joins the island to the mainland. Dotted with lakes and fringed by a few small lobster-fishing settlements, this rocky island is owned by the Queen's former herald. The coach will drop you close to the deserted village of Bostadh, where gale-force winds revealed an entire



Hebridean Time Travel

From Stornoway, travel south to **Harris**—a remote, wild and awe-inspiring Hebridean isle. The narrow road winds around lochs and between craggy mountains before reaching a series of stunning beaches. Pause at the bay of Horgabost Beach, where an enticing expanse of white sand fills the entire bay, washed by turquoise sea and backed by steep dunes. All this is set against the backdrop...



Historic Lewis

Depart from Stornoway, capital of the Outer Hebridean Isles and home of the Western Isles Council, which strives to promote the Gaelic language and culture. You'll cross the typical peat moors of central Lewis before heading toward the stunning west coast and the village of Callanish—site of the **Callanish Standing Stones**. This henge is the island's most dramatic prehist...



Lews Castle Grounds on Foot

Begin your guided **walking tour** at the pier. You'll wander along the waterfront that is dotted with delightful fishing boats. Cross a bridge and follow the pathway along the coastline. The grounds to your right were originally laid out as part of the formal gardens belonging to Lews Castle, built on the foundations of a hunting lodge from 1680. Arrive at a small jetty with fantastic...
