Tour Descriptions for Astoria, Oregon

HISTORIC ASTORIA & FORT CLATSOP

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_02

Discover historic Astoria! You'll make a brief photo stop at the Astoria Column which was built in 1926. This 125-foot tall concrete and steel structure features a cast-iron 164 step staircase that leads to an observation deck. If you decide to climb to the top, you'll see majestic views of Astoria, the Pacific Ocean and the snow-capped volcanoes of the Cascade Range.

Views from the base are just as panoramic, the column stands atop Coxcomb Hill, Astoria's highest point. Continue to the Lewis and Clark National Historical Park for a tour of Fort Clatsop. You'll also visit the Columbia River Maritime Museum located on Astoria's historic waterfront. The museum features nautical artifacts including the Lightship, which served as a floating lighthouse.

Enjoy a scenic drive through Astoria nestled between the Columbia River and Young's Bay. You'll see picturesque Victorian and Queen Anne style homes and churches, Uniontown - home of the men who worked at the Union Fish Cannery and the Doughboy monument, dedicated to the soldiers who gave their lives in World War I.

Note: At the maritime museum, the Lightship is not recommended for individuals with mobility challenges due to steep access ladders and elevated thresholds. Tour order and route may vary. Transportation used on this tour is a school bus.

SEASIDE & CANNON BEACH

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_04

Discover two of Oregon's most charming coastal villages and beautiful beaches. Your local guide will travel with you through Astoria, passing striking examples of Victorian architecture before crossing Young's Bay Bridge. Enjoy impressive views of Saddle Mountain, one of Oregon's highest peaks and the Astoria-Megler Bridge, the longest bridge in the state.

You'll travel through the Oregon Coast Range before stopping at Cannon Beach, considered an artist's colony and home to photographers, artists and writers. The beach is also well known for Haystack Rock, a 235 foot tall rock formation that is the home of puffins, sea gulls cormorants. You'll have some free time here to explore the colorful courtyards, streets and little shops.

Continue on to Seaside, a charming coastal village with boutiques, art galleries and miles of beach. A guide from

the Chamber of Commerce will introduce you to the town and its charms. Enjoy some free time here to stroll along the boardwalk, buy some salt water taffy or take a ride on the carousel.

SEAFOOD & WINE TASTING

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_05

Enjoy a tasting of Oregon wines at The Cellar on 10th, as you learn how to use your sense of smell and taste to fully appreciate these wines. The complexities of the locally grown and produced wines in Oregon compete with other world-class wineries. Pinot Gris, Riesling, Chardonnay and Pinot Noir are among the favorites.

Join Baked Alaska Restaurant's Chef Christopher Holen at the Oregon State University Seafood consumer center exhibition kitchen and immerse yourself in foods of the Pacific Northwest. Chef Holen will filet fresh salmon while discussing the various salmon species of the region. He will also demonstrate the proper way to cook salmon and offer you a sample.

The chef will bring ingredients and tools from Mise en Place, a local premier kitchenware shop, some items will also be available for purchase. More than just a cooking demonstration, the chef will entertain, educate and inspire you to try a recipe or two when you return home.

FLAVEL HOUSE, TEA & SCONES

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_06

Venture back to the days of a bygone era with a visit to the stately Flavel House Museum. The house was built in 1885 for Captain George Flavel, Astoria's first millionaire and one of its most prominent citizens. One of the best-preserved examples of Queen Anne architecture in the Northwest, Flavel House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

On the outside, this stunning mansion boasts a decorative exterior, three-story octagon tower, impressive balconies and verandas. Inside, the approximate 11,600 square foot mansion features elegant woodwork, stained glass windows, and in-laid hardwood floors. The three-story tower provided the Captain a panoramic view of

Astoria and the Columbia River.

After your tour, you're invited to sit and relax in the parlor for a cup of tea and scones. You'll have the opportunity to visit the restored Carriage House Gift Shop to purchase a souvenir, before returning to the pier.

Note: This tour involves steps inside and outside the house, including a wooden winding staircase.

ULTIMATE OREGON COAST

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_11

Discover Oregon's beautiful and dramatic coast, visit the air museum and cheese factory in Tillamook and enjoy a tasty lunch with Oregon wine. During the drive, enjoy impressive views of Saddle Mountain, one of Oregon's highest peaks and the Astoria-Megler Bridge, noted as the longest bridge in Oregon.

As your coach winds its way along the 110-mile section of the Pacific Coast Highway, you'll travel through the Oregon Coast Range. You'll pass Seaside, a charming village with boutiques, art galleries and miles of beach. As you continue south, you'll also pass Cannon Beach, famous for the natural phenomenon known as Haystack Rock. You'll make a brief stop here on your return drive to Astoria.

You'll visit the Tillamook Air Museum, which houses a rare World War II blimp hangar that is over 15 stories high and stretches over seven acres. You'll see a variety of U.S. warplanes and aircraft here and explore the exhibit hall to see historical wartime and aviation artifacts.

Enjoy a tasty lunch at the Blue Heron French Cheese Company, known for their Artisan sandwiches and salads and sample local wines offered by the glass. You'll also visit the Tillamook Cheese Factory - the farmer-owners have been producing quality dairy products here since 1909. Watch the cheese makers at work, enjoy a sample or two and indulge in some ice cream and fudge.

ASTORIA ALE TRAIL

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_12

Enjoy stunning views of the Columbia River while learning about local history and beer-making from your local

guides. You'll stop at the Fort George Brewery and Public House, specializing in innovative and exciting flavors such as coffee stout and wasabi-flavored ginger ale.

You'll also visit Rogue Ales located on the Astoria Riverwalk, a five-mile river trail that's lined with hotels, restaurants and parks. Made with the finest hops and barley malt, Rogue Ales are bottled using an oxygen absorbing cap, and brown glass for better shelf life. Your last stop is at The Wet Dog, where a variety of beers are handcrafted using a wide range of hops and grains to create unique flavors. The pub's riverfront deck is open during the summer.

FORT STEVENS BEHIND THE SCENES

Astoria, Oregon Tour Code: AST_15

Travel across Young's Bay Bridge for the short journey to Fort Stevens State Park. Upon arrival, your friendly and knowledgeable guide will take you on a tour and share the fascinating history of the fort which was built by the U.S. Army and completed in 1865. The gun batteries, fortifications and other buildings are preserved along with 3,700 acres of woodlands, lakes, wetlands and beaches.

Your guide will lead you through the complex and its bunkers, abandoned gun batteries, and tower stations before heading up to the commander's station for a scenic view of the Columbia River. The museum will be your last stop before heading back to the pier. Enjoy browsing through the interesting artifacts that date back to the Civil War and stop in at the gift shop, which offers a variety of souvenirs.

Activity Levels

ACTIVITY LEVEL 1 Involves walking over relatively level terrain, possibly some cobblestone, gravel or a few steps. Comfortable shoes are recommended.

ACTIVITY LEVEL 2 Involves a considerable amount of physical activity such as substantial walking over cobblestone streets, climbing stairs or steep terrain. They're not recommended for guests with walking difficulties. Comfortable, sturdy shoes are recommended.

ACTIVITY LEVEL 3 Involves physical exertion for extended periods. The terrain may be uneven or steep. It can also indicate a need for swimming in a light current, biking or horseback riding. Recommended only for physically fit and adventurous travelers.
