London (Dover), England

Visible for miles from sea, the White Cliffs of Dover are an instantly recognizable symbol of England. Modern highways make Dover the doorstep to London - Britain's ever-fascinating capital. Visitors to this great city have a wealth of pleasures to choose from. Explore the notorious Tower of London and view the Crown Jewels. Visit Windsor Castle or see Westminster Abbey. The choices are fascinating and endless. Dover is also your gateway to Kent's green countryside, dotted with old medieval towns and castles.

Dover has played a major role in world history since the days of the Norman invasion. Today 13th century Dover Castle dominates a harbour filled with cross-channel ferries and merchant and passenger shipping.

Points of Interest

1 Westminster Abbey, Parliament & Big Ben

London's three major icons are near each other. When parliament is in session after dark, a light shines from Big Ben's tower. Nearby Westminster Abbey has over a million visitors a year.

2 Tower of London

This historic fortress resides on the north bank of the Thames. The tower comprises several buildings set within two rings of defensive walls and a moat. It has served as a residence and a prison.

3 Buckingham Palace

This is the official royal palace of the British monarch since Queen Victoria ascended the throne in 1837. It is a venue for state and royal events and has the largest private garden in London.

4 Thames River & London Eye

A popular tourist attraction, the London Eye is located on the east bank of the Thames River. The wheel and its capsules take 30 minutes to do a full rotation and offers great views of the city.

5 Covent Garden

Known for its open-air cafés, pubs, shops and street performers, this former floral market now houses the London Film Museum and the London Transport Museum. The Royal Opera House resides nearby.

6 Harrods

Created by Henry Charles Harrod in 1849, this world-famous department store has seven floors covering 4.5 acres of retail goods and services. Don't miss the superb Food Halls.

7 Canterbury Cathedral & Leeds Castle

Cross the Greenwich Meridian to see two of England's historic landmarks: Leeds Castle, set in the middle of a lake surrounded by 500 acres, and Canterbury Cathedral, dating from the 11th century.

8 Rye

This little seaport draws visitors to its cobbled streets from around the world and can boast some famous former residents, like novelist Henry James and the children of former Beatle Paul McCartney.
