Margaret River, Australia

This vibrant coastal city is a laid-back charmer with an enticing array of natural wonders and active pursuits. Just steps from the mile-long Jetty are glistening white sand beaches and sun-drenched seaside villages. Yet the magic of the Margaret River area beckons with 120 premium wineries; ancient caves boasting a subterranean world of jaw-dropping stalactite, stalagmite, helictite and shawl formations; a fascinating Aboriginal culture rooted in ancient history; and a picture perfect landscape of meandering country roads and spectacular scenery.

Points of Interest

1 Ngilgi Caves

Discovered in 1899, the Ngilgi Cave remains one of the Capes' most visited attractions, offering a stunning display of rock formations plus an interpretive area which details the cave's Aboriginal mythology between good and evil.

2 A-Maze 'N Margaret River

A fun attraction that offers 12 acres of stunning gardens, outdoor games, and a giant-sized hedge maze with 6-foot-high hedges.

3 Aravina Estate

One of Margaret River's finest wine producers in the region. Established in 1986, this property stretches over 180-acres, of which 64 acres are under vine with plantings of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Shiraz, Tempranillo, Malbec, Sauvignon Blanc, Semillon, Chenin Blanc and Chardonnay.

4 Geographe Bay

Renowned for its sheltered pristine waters, rocky headlands and stunning beaches. From June to December, whales make their annual migration, traveling north to warmer water to birth their calves.

5 Dunsborough

Perched on picturesque Geographe Bay, Dunsborough began life as a whaling station over a century ago; today, the town offers plenty of chic boutiques, beautiful beaches and relaxed eateries.

6 Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse

Located at the northern end of Leeuwin-Naturaliste National Park, this lighthouse offers stunning views over Geographe Bay and the Indian Ocean.

7 Palmer Wines

Just 40 years old, this small winery is recognized as one of the leading wineries in the Margaret River Wine Region. Enjoy wonderful views while indulging in a tasting in the well-appointed Cellar Door.

8 Busselton Jetty

Recognized for its historical significance, the 150-year-old Heritage-Listed jetty stretches a mile out over the picturesque waters of Geographe Bay in the seaside resort town of Busselton.
