Molde: Haholmen - A Viking Adventure

ACTIVITY LEVEL: MODERATE

This tour will take you back in time at the fishing village of **Haholmen**. You will board your coach at the pier and pass through Molde on your way to the fishing village of **Bud**. You will then continue along **Hustadvika** to the impressive **Atlantic Ocean Road**, built in 1989, and linked by 8 bridges. You will board a genuine **replica of a Viking ship** and sail to Haholmen, an 18th century fishing village with its original wharves, traditional fishermen's shacks and bakery. You will see a film presentation about adventure voyages, **a meal** in one of the rustic restaurants, and time to explore this picturesque village. You will return to Molde along the Atlantic Road, passing through the village of **Eide** on your way.

Molde: Mardalsfossen Waterfall & Nettet Vicarage

ACTIVITY LEVEL: MODERATE

You will board your motor coach for the 1.5-hour drive to Mardalsfossen Waterfall where you will hike to the waterfall. The long Eikesdalsvatnet Lake is just 85 feet above sea level, while the surrounding mountains tower to heights of 5-6,000 feet straight up from the lake. The waterfall cascades 975 feet down into the valley and is the fourth highest waterfall in the world. Following your hike you will drive to Eikesdalen for lunch. On your return trip to Molde you will stop at Nettet Vicarage, the childhood home of Norwegian writer Bjornstjerne Bjornson.

Molde: Scenic Drive on the Atlantic Road

ACTIVITY LEVEL: EASY

Your tour will start with a brief sightseeing tour of Molde including the **Molde Church**, the **City Hall** and the **Museum of Romsdalen Valley** before you head to the **Varden Viewpoint** with its impressive view of Molde, **Romsdalsfjorden** and the 87 peaks of the Romsdals Alps. Then you will continue your scenic drive passing the village of **Eide** before entering one of the masterpieces of Norwegian engineering, the **Atlantic Road**. Opened in 1989, the road covers a distance of 5 miles including 8 bridges from islet to islet connecting Averoya Island to the mainland. Your tour will continue to the fishing village of Bud, where you will have a photo stop then pass by the **Church of Bud**, built in 1717, before returning to Molde.
