Historic Astoria and Fort Clatsop - AO01

Join the ranks of important visitors starting with Captain Robert Gray in 1792, Lewis and Clark's Corps of Discovery in 1805, and now you.

Walk in the footsteps of Lewis and Clark as you tour historic highlights of Astoria, the first permanent U.S. settlement on the Pacific coast. See the Astoria Column with its breathtaking view over Astoria, the Columbia River, and the Megler Bridge. Tour Fort Clatsop, a replica of the fort as depicted in Clark's journal. Mount St. Helens - A002

At 8:32 Sunday morning, May 18, 1980, Mount St Helens erupted. Mount St. Helens was shaken by an earthquake measuring 5.1 on the Richter scale, the north face of this tall symmetrical mountain collapsed in a massive rock debris avalanche. See for yourself how the environment is regrowing and reshaping the landscape naturally since the disturbance. On your journey up to the Monument you will relive Lewis & Clark travel from your motor coach and see many distinguishing features and landmarks along the bank of the Columbia River. Around the top of the mountain, you will see tremendous views of Mount St Helens, including craters, lava dome and blast zone.

See where the deadliest, most economically destructive volcanic event in the history of the United States took place. Notice how the environment has regrown and how the landscape reshaped since the disturbance. On your journey to and from, see many natural landmarks along the bank of the Columbia River. Around the top of the mountain, marvel at the tremendous views of Mount St Helens, including craters, lava dome and blast zone.

- Catastrophic eruption: On May 18, 1980, Mount St Helens erupted, followed by an earthquake measuring 5.1 on the Richter scale.
- A landscape transformed: See where the north face of this tall, symmetrical mountain collapsed in a massive rock debris avalanche.
- Landmarks along the way: From your coach, view natural features along the river, landmarks Lewis and Clark would have seen.

Willamette Valley Wine - AO10

The Willamette Valley is the Heart of Oregon Wine Country. As Oregon's leading wine region, the valley has two-thirds of the state's wineries and vineyards and is home to more than 200 wineries and tastings rooms.
